Information

Basics:

I have selected a variety of images to explore composition and design. The aim of this workshop is not to get you to paint like me but to learn to create dynamic compositions using good design principles.

Questions:

Please ask questions as it helps everyone on their learning journey. If I say anything you don't understand please ask me to clarify.

Reference Photos:

You can bring your own reference material for this workshop but I will also be providing reference images closer to the date of the workshop for you to print out and bring along.

What to Bring

Paint:

As this is an all medium workshop bring along your personal supplies for whatever medium you will be painting in.

For oil painters please do not bring any solvent based mediums or cleannig products as the colour circle building is a solvent free environment.

It is always advisable to use the best quality paints you can afford. Student quality paints are good when you are learning but please note that they will not yield the exact same results as the artist quality.

Painting surface: Bring along a small sized canvas or paper depending on your medium.

As this is a one day workshop you may only have time to start a small painting of the painting you design. If you are a fast painter please bring more than one canvas/paper.

Paper size: Please bring any sized canvas that is smaller than 45cm.

Bring lots of spare drawing paper for doing exercises, thumbnails and sketches

Easel: table top easel (limited easel options available)

Board: a board to attach your paper to for watercolour and pastel paintiners.

Brushes: make sure you bring your brushes if you are painting in acrylic or oils.

Other Stuff: Palette, pencils, sketchbook, notebook and pen.
